

**VUDA Resolution No.24 dated 2.4.2002**

The VUDA Board has noticed that large number of shops and establishment are continued to be un-allotted despite several notifications at times. Board has felt that there were no Government orders on the point of Reservation as regards allotment of shops / Establishments pertaining to VUDA in the absence of which, needy and educated unemployed including categories like widows, physically handicapped, S.Cs., S.Ts and other economically weaker sections, minorities, service oriented individuals / associations are deprived of the benefits in the allotment of shops / Establishments by VUDA, though the VUDA Board intends to extend such benefits.


In the light of the above, as a measure of social justice, it is resolved to request the Government to empower the Vice Chairman / Chairman to exercise allotting shops / establishments in respect of the above categories not exceeding 5% of the total number of vacant shops etc., in a year at the discretion of the Vice Chairman / Chairman without loss or without subsidy by VUDA.

**VUDA Resolution No.25 dated 2.4.2002**

The VUDA Board has noticed that in G.O.Ms.No.113 M.A., dated 24.2.1984 under normal procedure of allotment of flats / houses, there were no reservations for allotment in respect of widows, physically handicapped, minorities or even to those who are involved in the fields of either philanthropic or in social service etc., Therefore the VUDA Board has unanimously resolved to request the Government to empower the Vice Chairman / Chairman to allot certain percentage say 3 to 5% of the houses / flats / sites of the new schemes to the real, genuine and deserving people including the above categories at the discretion of the Vice Chairman / Chairman without resorting normal allotment procedure.
