Sub: - VUDA - Visakhapatnam - Payment of Medical Allowance - Sri B.Vishnu Murthy, Junior Assistant - Reg.

The employees of VUDA are being paid Medical Allowances equal to One Month Basic Pay every year in four quarterly instalments in terms of Board Resolution No. 120 Dt. 31-8-89.

One Sri B.Vishnu Murthy, Junior Assistant, VUDA has undergone kidney Transplantation Operation in 1995 for acute renal failure. On his representation he was sanctioned Rs. 50,000/- towards Medical aid for the kidney Transplantation as Grant + Rs. 50,000/- as Discretionary loan.

Subsequently, the said employee in his representation dated. 18-9-97 had submitted that an amount of Rs. 4.05 lakhs was incurred from his own financial resources for undergoing the operation and that after completion of operation he was incurring an expenditure of Rs. 4,474/- per month towards expenditure on medicines as per the advise of the Doctors and requested for sanction of medical re-imbusement (actuals) in lieu of medical allowance being paid to him.

The matter has been examined with reference to A.P.I.M.A Rules 1972. As per these rules, the Government servants are eligible for re-imbusement of Rs. 50,000/- for undergoing operation in the specified hospitals for acute renal failure. The benefit has already been extended to the said Junior Assistant.

The Government Servants are eligible for free medical treatment in Government Hospitals. The re-imbusement is admissible to the extent of cost of medicines only which are not stocked in Government Hospitals but no re-imbusement is admissible in respect of consultation fee and nursing charges.

In view of this, the request of the individual was placed before the VUDA and the VUDA Board in its Resolution No. 80, dated. 28-3-98 had resolved to approve the proposals of re-imbusement of medical expenses to Sri B.Vishnu Murthy, Junior Assistant as a special case. Accordingly, monthly medical

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bills upto Rs. 4,474/- covering only cost of medicines are being re-imbursed with effect from 15-4-98 in lieu of medical allowance being paid to him every Quarter based on the essentiality certificate being given by the Specialist in C.T.R. Hospitals, Visakhapatnam.

The Government in their Letter No. 10829/B1/99-1 M.A. Dated. 25-6-99 have permitted the VUDA to reimburse the only cost of medicines to Sri B.Vishnu Murthy, Junior Assistant for obtaining necessary certificates and medical bills from the individual up to the period which requires for Post Renal Transplant Disease, are essential for the recovery of the Kidney on humanitarian ground as a special case from VUDA funds, as the case was referred to K.G.H. to appear before the Medical Board to assess his present health status and the essentiality of the treatment. The Superintendent, K.G.H. in his letter Dated. 22-4-2002 has stated that the individual was examined by Chief Nephrologist, K.G.H. Visakhapatnam and certified that the medicines used by him are essential for maintaining normal graft function. In the letter it was not stated any thing about Medical Board Opinion.

The matter is placed before VUDA Board for taking a decision regarding reimbursement of Rs. 4,474/- to the individual per month.

1. As per Government rules, the employees are eligible for reimbursement of medical expenditure to an amount of Rs. 75,000/- for the following elements.
 - a) Acute Myocardial infraction (Cardiology Dept) and Coronary Artery Diseases.
 - b) Acute renal failure (Nephrology Dept)
 - c) Severe cases of head and spinal injury (neuro-Surgery Dept)
 - d) Cases of Coma (neurology Dept.)
2. The Govt. employees are also eligible for reimbursement of medical bills on essentially Certificates issued by the authorised medical Attendant (i.e. Medical Officer not below the rank of an Assistant Civil Surgeon)
