

Sub: Engg - VUDA - Providing Street Lighting to Visakhapatnam - Bheemili Beach Road (balance stretch of widened portion) from Rushikonda ITSEZ Junction to Mangamaripeta near Kapuluppada - Draft subject placed before VUDA Board for perusal & approval - Reg

Agenda Note:

VUDA has taken up widening and improvement of Visakhapatnam - Bheemili Beach Road for a length of 15KM from Appughar to Mangamaripeta except the stretch from 4KM to 6KM i.e. from Sagar Nagar to Karthikavanam executed by R&G Department and completed as per the directions of Government. While developing the Visakhapatnam - Bheemili Beach Road Central Street Lighting is also provided with RCC Spun Poles and T-5 Technology lamp fixtures. After completion of work The Street Lighting along for the stretch from 6KM to 12KM was handed over to Greater Visakhapatnam Municipal Corporation for further maintenance.

The Visakhapatnam - Bheemili Beach Road is an important Road connecting ITSEZ's developed on Rushikonda Hills, Vignan Educational Institution, Thollakonda - Bavikonda Buddhist Heritage Hills and Bheemili an important tourist place having importance of Dutch cemeteries etc.

Since Street Lighting is very much needed during night time travelers for balance stretch of Bheemili Beach road, VUDA proposes to extend the Street Lighting along Central Median from Rushikonda ITSEZ Junction to Mangamaripeta (balance stretch of Visakhapatnam - Bheemili Beach Road developed by VUDA of length of 3KM) with an estimated cost of Rs 50.00 Lakhs.

The Street Lighting now proposed consists of RCC Spun Poles of 8.00 Mtrs height and SWRL Street Light fixtures using 65W CFL lamps for low consumption of energy and easy maintenance. The estimate prepared for Rs 50.00 Lakhs is submitted to Vice Chairman, VUDA to accord Administrative Sanction with permission to take up the work by way of e-tenders.

Hence, the matter is placed before VUDA Board for perusal and approval
